


Educate locally and nationally about the importance of technology as a basic student need

70% of students reported that not having access to a reliable internet connection was a barrier to their success over the course of


1 in 3 students faced limited internet access

56% of students need access to technology




UA Libraries – Laptop Use Jan '20 – Dec '21

Oct. 2022 Survey - UA Demographics Comparison




UA Demographics Compared to Survey Response and Laptop Use


