



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## What Is **Prop 308?** Info Session

#### What Is It?

Provides in-state tuition for all Arizona students regardless of their immigration status if they meet a set of qualifications

#### What Are The Qualifications?

#### Why Is It Impactful?

- Less financial constraints
- Free of institutional barriers and discrimination • Greater access and more likely to strive for higher education


## **Before Prop 308 Implementation**

'Students who **didn't** have legal status in the US were required to pay the "non-resident rate" which is 150% more than instate tuition costs' So what does this look like you may ask yourself?



## **Tuition Rate Comparison**

UNIVERSITY/INSTITUTE	SEMESTER RATE W/ PROP 308
University of Arizona	\$6,600
Grand Canyon University	\$8,900
Pima Community College	\$1,125

#### What Options Are Out **There**? For Undocumented Students Who Do Not Qualify

#### **State Aid**

Accessible to everyone regardless of immigration status, therefore Prop 308 **does not** affect eligibility for state aid BUT still have to go through a set of qualifications and applications - Includes fee waivers, tuition waivers, scholarships, and grants given by the college or organizations

#### **Federal Aid**

#### **Private Opportunities**

- The Dream U.S. Scholarship
- Dollars for Scholars
- Golden Door Scholarship
- Fellowships/Internships
- Private Institutions

#### Federal aid is **FASFA** and the **Pell Grant**, we **do not** recommend Undocumented or DACAmented students to apply unless a school or scholarship application asks for it



Yes 58.6%




Don't wait for students to ask for help, to begin educating yourself to know how to help. Undocumented students can do & be whatever they want, they just need the right support.

• Show them alternatives that relate to their desired degree.



How to Actively Support Undocumented Professionals



### Pair & share

Turn to the person next to you and discuss what barriers exist for Undocumented folx entering the world of work.

#### **Barriers for folx without** a work permit

- No SSN
- Background checks
- No access to professional licenses
- E-verify

1. <u>Self-employment</u>: There are multiple ways to work for yourself, including independent contracting (also called consulting or freelancing) and establishing a formal business (ImmigrantsRising).


1. <u>Employement sponsorship</u> When an employee sponsors a noncitizen to attain either temporary visa (non-immigrant based) or permanent residency (immigrant based) in order to work for them.

#### Alternatives to employment:

## How to Actively Support Undocumented Students

 Have career conversations early and often
Use your networks to connect your students to local employers for internships/fellowships
Encourage them to get involved & network
Respond to barriers by creating access
When a career related event is offered, ask yourself "is this space inclusive/helpful to Undocumented students?"
