The AZ HSI Consortium was founded in 2021 by Dr. Marla Franco, Vice President of Hispanic Serving Institution Initiatives at the University of Arizona and Dr. Rey Rivera, President at Estrella Mountain Community College. The AZ HSI Consortium aims to bring together all HSIs across Arizona to develop a community of practice to engage collectively in professional development, support the exchange of evidence-based and intentional practices, facilitate successful transfer of students to Arizona universities, and collaborate across HSIs when seeking funding opportunities and other important partnerships.

HSI Criteria

Hispanic Serving Institution is a federal designation given by the U.S. Department of Education to recognize institutions that have more than 25% Hispanic undergraduate enrollment. Beyond meeting an enrollment metric, HSIs have a responsibility to bring the designation to life in ways that matter most for all who come to learn and work at HSIs.

The 3rd Annual AZ HSI Summit took place on **October 04, 2024 at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, AZ.** The summit is a one-day, in-person conference for faculty, staff, administrators, students, and community partners aimed at:

- Showcasing and exchanging evidence-based practices that effectively and intentionally support Latinx students
- Building capacity among faculty and staff to teach and lead at HSIs
- Creating opportunities for networking and community building across AZ HSIs and Emerging HSIs





In 2024, the AZ HSI Consortium launched the AZ HSI GATE funding opportunities aimed to support individuals and teams from AZ HSIs in leading efforts that align with the consortium's aims and in direct response to one of the two funding tracks.



Track 1

Awards will support projects at Arizona HSIs that identify barriers to and within higher education for learners, engage in institutional problem solving, implement solutions that support learner success, and document how change at Arizona HSIs was implemented.

Track 2

Awards will support projects at Arizona HSIs that stimulate and support change and research that enriches our understanding in broadening participation in STEM at HSIs.

Virtual Kick-Off: January 2025

HSI Grants Development Institute



On November 22, 2024, UA HSII held its 4th annual HSI Grants Development Institute, hosted by HSI partner, Pima Community College. The purpose of this full-day institute is to: 1) generate awareness of HSI related funding opportunities; 2) strengthen understanding of HSI models and frameworks; and 3) cultivate networks among those with shared interests for pursuing HSI funding opportunities. This year was the first time that participants from HSIs outside of AZ were able to attend. Demand was high, with a waitlist of up to 50 people. This work was supported by the National Science Foundation, awards #2336054 & #2311013.



Curriculum Development Institute

Launched in 2021, the <u>Curriculum Development Institute (CDI)</u>, is a week-long summer immersion focused on training and coaching faculty and instructors towards implementation of effective teaching practices into existing courses of all modalities, including distance and online learning environments.

During HACU's 38th Annual Conference, the consortium collaborated with InsideTrack to host the HSI Consortium Conexión Dinner on November 2nd. Leaders and directors from HSI consortiums were invited to a conversation and input-gathering session that centered on developing tools to advance HSI consortia nationally. In total, 25 attendees represented various institutions and community organizations.

Critical conversations were facilitated and revolved around three key questions. A thematic analysis will be conducted based on the responses gathered. A six-month HSI Consortium Conexión convening will occur in Spring 2025 open to all who attended the dinner to share insights collected from the thematic analysis.



Dr. Mara Lopez joined the team in May 2024 as the inaugural HSI Research Center Director.



Dr. Mara Nohemi Lopez is the inaugural Director of the HSI Research Center at the University of Arizona. Prior to this, she worked as the Associate Director of Research at the Center for Broadening Participation in STEM at Arizona State University (ASU). She earned a doctorate in education from ASU with an emphasis on leadership and innovation, an MA in Organizational Leadership from Point Loma Nazarene University, and a BA in Psychology from San Diego State University.

She has worked in research for over 17 years on NIH, NSF, DoD, and DoE grants. Funded by the NSF and the Helios Education Foundation, Dr. Lopez is charged with leading efforts for the AZ HSI Consortium and supports collaborative programs engaging researchers, educators, and stakeholders to address key challenges and opportunities for HSIs and Emerging HSIs. This work informs advocacy aimed at fostering conditions that support student success in Arizona and nationwide.
